# ANNUAL REPORT OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

## WEST BENGAL

For the year 2019 - 20

(1<sup>st</sup> April 2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020)

### BRIEF HISTORY

- 1) The evolution of the Public Service Commission in India can be traced back to the persistent demands raised by the educated Indians for admission into the Indian Civil Service. The Montagu-Chelmsford report incorporated a provision regarding this demand of the Indian Youth and ultimately the Govt. of India Act, 1919 saved the path for the formation of the Public Service Commissions. Section 96C of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 provided for the establishment of a Public Service Commission in India to regulate the recruitment and control the public services in India and perform such functions as may be assigned thereto by Rules made by the Secretary of State in Council.
- 2) The passing of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 was followed by a protracted correspondence stretching over four years between the Secretary of State, the Govt. of India and local Governments regarding the framework of the body to be constituted. Subsequently, the Lee Commission in its report dated 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1924, recommended the establishment of the Public Service Commission as suggested by the Government of India Act, 1919 without any further delay.
- 3) Pursuant to the provisions of the Section 96(C) of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 and the recommendation of the Lee Commission, Central Public Service Commission was set up for the first time in India in October, 1926. It was formed in accordance with the traditions of the British Civil Service Commission. The functions of the Public Service Commission were regulated by the Public Service Commission (Functions) Rules, 1926 framed under Sub-Section (2) of Section 96(C) of the Government of India Act, 1919. These rules provided for consultation with the Commission in respect of recruitment to All India Services, Central Services Class I and Class II, on questions of drawing up of syllabi for examinations and of qualifications for recruitment by selection, on promotion to these services, on disciplinary cases, on questions connected with pay and allowances, pension, provident funds, leave rules and conditions of service.
- 4) The next significant development in the history of Public Service Commission in India was the issuance of a White Paper in December, 1931 delineating proposals for Indian Constitutional Reforms. The White Paper also contained a blue print of the Public Service Commissions for the proposed Federation and the provinces. The report of the Joint Committee on Indian Constitutional Reforms (1934) further reiterated the need for setting up a federal PSC and a PSC for each province. The Govt. of India Act, 1935 envisaged a Public Service Commission for the federation and a Provincial Public Service Commission for each Province or Group of Provinces.
- 5) In terms of the provisions of this Act and its coming into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> April, 1937, a Public Service Commission was formed in each province except in cases of certain provinces which formed the Joint Public Service Commissions. This is the background for the emergence of Bengal Public Service Commission in 1937 and its continuance as the PSC, West Bengal.
- 6) The Constituent Assembly realized the importance of giving a secure and autonomous status to the Public Service Commissions both at Federal and Provincial levels for ensuring recruitment to Civil Services without any prejudiced and protection of service interests. With the promulgation of the new Constitution for independent India on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 1950, Public Service Commissions in the States were accorded a Constitutional Status in terms of Article 315.

7) After its formation, the PSC, W.B. started functioning from Bhabani Bhavan, Alipore. Subsequently, Examination Section of the office shifted to Town Hall, Kolkata while rest of the office operated from Bhabani Bhavan. After several years, the Town Hall was vacated and the Examination Section was accommodated in a building adjacent to Bhabani Bhavan. At that time, 2 floors of a building near Sealdah were used as examination venue. In the year 1989, the entire office of the PSC, W.B. was shifted to a newly constructed building at 161A, S.P. Mukherjee Road, Mudiali, Near Tollygunge Rly. Bridge. All the sections of the P.S.C., W.B. as well as exam. Venues are at present located in this building.

The Annual Report for the year ending on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020, has since been compiled. The core functions and the activities of the various sections of the Commission's Secretariat have been highlighted in the Annual Report. Data in respect of the examinations/selection procedures conducted, candidates recommended for employment, important information linked to the duties performed by the Commission have been incorporated to give an idea about the workload of the Commission during the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2019 to 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020.

The initiatives undertaken by the Commission to utilize the information and technology resources in its operations have started yielding results. The reduction in time interval between the publication of an advertisement and the declaration of results was achieved in case of major recruitment examinations / selection cases due to adoption of certain innovative measures and speedy implementation of e-governance in the last three years. The aim of the Commission is to develop the existing on-line set up and ultimately to conduct majority of the examinations on-line in order to limit the time gap in respect of publication of results to the bare minimum.

The Public Service Commission, West Bengal endeavours to instill the highest level of efficiency in the discharge of its duties and responsibilities. The Commission would like to introduce more reforms and adopt new strategies in the coming years in keeping with the demands of the future generation.

## PART I

### GENERAL

As a body enshrined in the constitution of India, the Public Service Commission, West Bengal, has sincerely remained active in discharging its constitutional duties and living up to its tradition as inherited from the Bengal Public Service Commission that was formed under the Government of India Act, 1935 and which started functioning with effect from April, 1937. A report on its working during the year 2019-2020 is set forth hereunder.

#### 1. The commission and its composition.

#### 4. Functions of the Commission:

The Constitution of India has enjoined consultation with the Public Service Commission on matters of appointment and certain other matters as specified in Article 320 in respect of the Civil Services and posts. The Public Service Commission has to perform the duties relating to matters specified in that Article. These include conducting examinations for appointment to Civil Services and posts under the State Government and advising the State Government on all matters relating to methods of recruitment to Civil Services and posts, on the principles to be followed in making appointments to Civil Services and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another, on the suitability of candidates for such appointments, promotions or transfers and on all disciplinary matters affecting a person serving under the State Government in a civil capacity and on certain other matters.

Article 229 and Article 234 also contain provisions in terms of which the Commission is required to be consulted in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts in offices attached to the

High Court and to the State Judicial Service respectively. Besides, Acts made for certain statutory bodies contain provisions for consultation with the Commission in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts under such bodies. Article 321 also contains provision in terms of which additional functions may be entrusted to the Commission by an Act made by the State Legislature as respects the services of the State or any local authority or anybody corporate or any public institution. Such an Act has, however, not been made till now.

The Commission is consulted by the State Govt. in making recruitment to a majority of Civil Services and posts. However, some posts under the State Govt. have been kept outside the purview of the Commission by making regulations in terms of the proviso to Article 320(3) of the Constitution. Such regulations are the West Bengal Public Service Commission (Exemption from Consultation) Regulations, 2008.

## **5. Workload of the Commission :**

A statistical account of the main items of work performed by the Commission during the year 2019-2020 is given in the following pages under the caption: **Workload at a Glance.**

During the period under report, the Commission held **1208** sittings to interview and select candidates for direct recruitment to various services and posts. Altogether **9794** candidates were called in for interviews. The Commission continued its practice of inviting experts of different disciplines to assist it in the matter of selection of candidates and thus it maintained liaison with various universities, institutions and organizations.

For direct recruitment by competitive examination with or without interview, the Commission held **10(ten)** different kinds of recruitment examinations. There were altogether **1497076** candidates applied, **1515504** candidates allowed including 18428 candidates for 3 (Three) Main/Final exams. and **1005247** candidates appeared for these examinations including **14600** candidates in the **03(three)** Main Examinations. During the year under report, the Commission allotted **1335** candidates including **315** Scheduled Caste, **153** scheduled Tribe and **233(B.C.'A'-154,B.C.'B'-79)** Backward Class candidates for appointment to different services and posts on the results of different recruitment examinations.

For direct recruitment through selection by interview (with or without preliminary written test) the Commission advertised **1078** posts of different categories and received altogether **166102** applications ( including 67598 applications for PST/PWT etc.). Preliminary written tests were held for **36** categories of posts for the purpose of short-listing of candidates. After selection, during the period under report, the Commission recommended **990** candidates including **234** S.C., **53** S.T., **120** B.C.(A), **79** B.C.(B) and **19** P.H. candidates for appointment to different services and posts. No candidates had been recommended by the Commission for appointment to different services and posts from the reserve lists prepared on earlier selections.

For promotion, the Commission held **88** sittings to discuss the cases with the representatives of the concerned departments of the State Government. Altogether **765** vacancies in different services and posts were reported to the Commission for being filled up by promotion. During the period under report, the Commission recommended **714** officers for promotion after considering cases of **2176** officers and could not make any recommendation against **51** vacancies for various reasons.

In disciplinary matters, during the period under report, the Govt. forwarded **126** cases (**79** fresh and **47** old) to the Commission for advice. 49 cases had been pending with the Commission till the close of the previous year. The Commission was able to tender its advice only in **53** cases, while the remaining **41** cases were sent back to the Govt. asking for necessary papers/particulars and **81** cases including 01 overriding case were pending with the Commission till the closing of the year (i.e. **31/03/2020**).

The Commission also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for **32** different categories of services and posts and on **03** cases regarding revision of examination rules.

During the year under report, the Commission held Half-Yearly Departmental Examination in May & November, **2019** each time for **6** different categories of officers serving under the Govt. of West Bengal including those of I.A.S. probationers. The total number of registered candidates for the Departmental Examinations was **6355**.

Despite the fact that Commission performs its function according to the rules and regulations, the commission was impleaded as a Respondent in a number of court cases during the period under report. The cases were defended as per the rules and regulations as well as on the strength of records relating to the case. **80** fresh litigations, **05** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **30** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta and **45** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were filed involving the Commission during the period under report, out of which **56** cases (**04** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **20** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta and **32** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative

Tribunal) were contested by the Commission .Besides, **124** cases (including old pending cases), **05** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **65** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, **54** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal against the Commission are pending. Apart from the aforesaid cases, **21** cases, **15** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, and in **06** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were disposed of during the period under report.

**Table I** intra gives previous and current year's figures on certain items of work.

## **6. OBSERVATIONS**

### ***A. Requirement of consultation with the Commission regarding promotion:***

The Commission has noticed that the proviso to Article 320(3 )(b) is being interpreted by many Departments of the Government that consultation with the Commission is not necessary for making promotion from one post to another where the posts are (i) within the same service and (ii) not belonging to any service (i.e. the posts of West Bengal. General Service). The Commission is of the view that such interpretation would not be in consonance with the spirit of the Constituion. The Patna High Court in the case of Hariprasad Vs. State (AIR-1972, Patna-4) and the Supreme Court in the case of Jammu and Kashmir Vs. Rajdulari Rajdan and others (AIR 1979-SC-586 and 587) gave the judgement in favour of consultation with the Commission in all cases of promotions. It is mentioned in this connection that the Union Public Service Commission after discussion on the point at the National Conference of the Chairmen of the State Public Service Commissions, has sought an amendment to Article 320(3)(b) in its memorandum to the National Commission set up to review the working of the Constitution so that the scope of interpreting the existing. expression in the Article is obviated and the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another.

The Commission expects that the State Government would consider the matter and take steps so that the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another in all cases.

### ***B. Reporting of vacancies to the Commission for various recruitment examinations :***

The Commission has been experiencing difficulties in obtaining estimates of vacancies from the Departments of Government in time. In some cases much delay occurs in reporting vacancies to the Commission despite urgent requests and repeated reminders. Consequently, holding of personality tests after the written examinations in the concerned cases gets deferred and finalization of results of the examinations is delayed. Often vacancies are reported long after the completion of personality tests. Such vacancies cannot be accepted for that particular examination and remain to be filled up on the results of the next examination. Needless to mention that an estimate of vacancies is necessary for the Commission to fix up the number of candidates for the personality tests and once the personality test is completed on the basis of the estimated record, further vacancies for the particular examination cannot be accepted.

The Commission feels that it may be possible for the Departments of the Government to make a forecast of vacancies to occur in a year due to retirement. Additional vacancies due to resignations and/or creation of posts can also be accommodated mostly by the time the estimate of vacancies is required for the personality test. Such procedure should be followed in the cases of annual recruitment examinations in view of the difficulties mentioned above.

An annual calendar of vacancies in the posts within the purview of the annual recruitment examinations may be prepared and maintained by the appointing authority so that an estimate of vacancies in the posts for the annual recruitment examinations could be furnished positively by the 31st of March of the year of the examinations taking into account the vacancies to be available by the 31st of December of that year.

**C. Disciplinary cases—Incomplete reference from Government Departments :**

The Commission reiterates its earlier observation that the disciplinary cases are mostly referred to it for advice without furnishing necessary documents and particulars. Such cases are therefore required to be sent back to the Departments concerned and thus it is unnecessarily delayed.



**D. Extension of Pre-examination Training Facilities :**




The Commission in its earlier annual reports tendered advice in favour of the extension of the existing facilities of pre-examination training of SC/ST candidates, for various recruitment examinations. It is noticed that a good number of vacancies reported for these categories of candidates remained unfilled for want of suitable candidates, even after sufficiently lowering the general standard, during the period under report. The Commission suggests that the Government may consider opening training centres in various places in the State, especially in the tribal concentrated districts.


**E. Departmental Examinations—Ensuring Appearance of the officers at the Examinations :**

It has come to the notice of the Commission that quite a large number of officers whose cases are forwarded to it and who are admitted to these examinations do not appear at the examinations, causing much inconvenience to the Commission as also wastage of time and drainage of money. So, the Commission suggests that the officers applying for the Departmental Examinations should be instructed by the Departments/Officers concerned to appear at the examinations without fail.





The examination was held at Kolkata and Darjeeling. In all 1,448 candidates applied for the examination of whom 924 candidates took their examination.

**(ii) West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) Etc. (Main) Examination, 2019:**

Dates of Examination – 25.07.2019 to 28.07.2019 :

On the basis of the results of preliminary examination, 15,997 candidates were allowed to take the main examination. Finally 13,005 candidates appeared at the examination

**(iii) Examination(Preliminary) for Recruitment to the post of Supervisor (Female only) of ICDS, 2019**

Date of Examination – 01.09.2019:

The examination was held in 27 centres throughout West Bengal including Darjeeling. The centres were :

Kolkata (North), Kolkata (South), Baruipur, Diamond Harbour, Barrackpore, Barasat-Krishnagar, Howrah-, Chinsurah Burdwan, Asansol, Purulia, Medinipur, Tamluk, Jhargram, Bankura, Suri, Berhampore, Malda, Balurghat, Raiganj, Jalpaiguri, Alipurduar, Cooch Behar, Siliguri, Kalimpong, Darjeeling.

In all 3,66,475 candidates applied for the examination. Finally, 2,83,680 candidates appeared at the examination.

**(iv) West Bengal Works Accountant Recruitment (Mains) Examination, 2018:**

Dates of Examination – 11.01.2020 :

The examination was held in Kolkata only. A total number of 2027 candidates applied for the examination. Finally, 1377 candidates appeared at the examination.

(v) **CLERKSHIP EXAMINATION (PART I),2019**

Date of Examination – 25.01.2020

The examination was held in 27 centres throughout West Bengal including Darjeeling. The centres were :

Kolkata (North), Kolkata (South), Baruipur, Diamond Harbour, Barrackpore, Barasat-Krishnagar, Howrah-, Chinsurah Burdwan, Asansol, Purulia, Medinipur, Tamluk, Jhargram, Bankura, Suri, Berhampore, Malda, Balurghat, Raiganj, Jalpaiguri, Alipurduar, Cooch Behar, Siliguri, Kalimpong, Darjeeling.

In all 7,48,472 candidates applied for the examination..Finally, 4,26,011 candidates appeared at the examination.

(vi) **West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) Etc. (Preliminary) Examination, 2020 :**

Date of Examination – 09.02.2020

The examination was held in 20 centres throughout West Bengal including Darjeeling. Number of venues at different centres were as follows :–

Kolkata (North) – 66, Kolkata (South) – 44, Baruipur – 21, Diamond Harbour – 07, Barrackpore – 67, Barasat – 36, Howrah – 21, Burdwan – 34, Asansol – 19, Medinipur – 25, Tamluk – 12, Bankura – 20, Berhampore – 34, Malda – 30, Jalpaiguri – 11, Alipurduar – 10, Cooch Behar – 16, Siliguri – 25, Kalimpong – 3, Darjeeling – 8.

In all 2,10,596 candidates applied for the examination all of whom were allowed to appear at the examination. Finally, 1,64,397 candidates appeared at the examination.

(vii) **West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service (Preli) Examination, 2019**

Date of Examination – 16.02.2020

The examination was held at Kolkata and Darjeeling centres. 7,193 candidates applied for the examination of which 4,503 candidates took their examination.

(viii) **West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service (MAINS) Examination, 2018**

Dates of Examination – 20.02.2020 and 22.02.2020 to 26.02.2020

The examination was held at Kolkata only.. 404 candidates qualified for the examination of which 218 candidates took their examination

(ix) **Miscellaneous Service (Preli) Examination, 2019:**

Date of Examination – 08.03.2020:

The examination was held in 26 centres throughout West Bengal including Darjeeling. The centres with number of venues were :

Kolkata (North) – 78, Baruipur – 17 Diamond Harbour – 06, Barrackpore – 35, Barasat- 29, Krishnagar – 23, Howrah – 17, Chinsurah – 25 Burdwan – 23, Asansol – 10, Purulia – 09, Medinipur – 17, Tamluk-10, Jhargram – 04, Bankura – 11, Suri – 11, Berhampore – 16, Malda – 11, Balurghat-06, Raiganj-06, Jalpaiguri – 8, Alipurduar – 07, Cooch Behar – 12, Siliguri – 15, Kalimpong – 03, Darjeeling – 04.

In all 1,62,300 candidates applied for the examination..Finally, 1,10,856 candidates appeared at the examination.

**LIMITED DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION**

1. Limited Departmental Examination of eligible employees of the Govt. of West Bengal for promotion to the posts in West Bengal Audit and Accounts Service, 2019 : Dates of Examination – 06.11.2019 to 08.11.2019

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Hall at Kolkata. 592 candidates applied for the examination.. 276 candidates appeared at the examination .

**9. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATIONS:**

During the year under report, Half-yearly Departmental/Professional Examination was held in May and November of officers of 6 (six) different categories serving under the Government of West Bengal. In May, 2019, number of officers registered for the examination was 3,182 . In November, 2019, the number of registered candidates were 3,173.

**10. ADOPTION OF UNFAIRMEANS BY CANDIDATES IN THE EXAMINATIONS CONDUCTED BY THE COMMISSION :**

During the year under report, 28 (twenty eight) candidates were reported against by the Supervisors of different examination centres for adoption of unfair means in various examinations conducted by the Commission. The particulars of the cases showing the nature of offences and the penal measures taken against them are given in **Appendix – VIII**

## PART –III

### DIRECT RECRUITMENT

#### 11. Recruitment after advertisement and interviews:

During the year under report, the Commission considered the proposals from Government reporting altogether 1078 posts of various categories for appointment, after advertisement and interviews for recommendation from the reserve lists. Details are given in Appendix-II (A) & Appendix-II (B) (synopsis)- 235 of the above posts were reserved for members of S.C., 73 for S.T., 120 for B.C.(A), 76 for B.C.(B), and 49 for Persons with Disabilities candidates.

Regarding the 1078 posts, as above, the commission took action as follows –

- (a) No recommendation have been made from its previous reserve lists during the year under report.
- (b) Advertised the 1078 posts including 235 posts reserved for S.C., 73 for S.T., 120 for B.C. (A), 76 for B.C.(B), and 49 for Persons with Disabilities candidates.

In response to the advertisements mentioned at (b) above 166102 applications (including 67598 applications for PST/PWT etc.) were received.

The number of candidates called for interview during the year under report was 6120 including 1412 S.C., 255 S.T., 743 B.C. (A), 813 B.C. (B) and 166 Persons with Disabilities candidates. Out of whom 5175 candidates including 1160 S.C., 201 S.T., 644 B.C.(A), 687 B.C.(B). and 114 Persons with Disabilities candidates appeared at the interviews. The Commission held 859 sittings during the year under report for interviewing the candidates.

Out of 1078 vacancies advertised, the Commission recommended candidates for appointment to 990 vacancies including 485 for general candidates [10 S.C., 00 S.T., 05 B.C. (A), & 06 B.C.(B) candidates ranked amongst the general candidates on merit were recommended against unreserved vacancies], 234 for S.C., 53 for S.T., 120 B.C.(A), 79 for B.C.(B) & 19 for Persons with Disabilities candidates. In respect of the remaining 86 posts including 08 reserved for S.C., 19 for S.T., 05 for B.C.(A), 02 for B.C.(B) & 29 for Persons with Disabilities candidates, no candidates was available and hence the Commission could not make any recommendation.

In all, therefore, the Commission could recommend 990 candidates for 100 different categories during the year under report including 234 posts reserved for S.C, 53 for S.T., 120 for B.C.(A), 79 for B.C.(B) & 19 for Persons with Disabilities candidates. During the year under report, Government dealt with the recommendations as follows:

The Commission made recommendation for filling up of 714 (144 S.C. & 34 S.T.) vacancies during the period. The Commission Could not made any recommendation for filling up of remaining 51 vacancies for want of suitable officer in some cases owing to non-availability of the relevant service records and information/ ACRs etc. The details may be seen in Appendix - III

The Commission considered the cases of 282 S.C. & 86 S.T. Officers for promotion. Of them, the Commission recommended 125 S.C. & 23 S.T. officers against the said reserved vacancies. The Commission also recommended 19 S.C. officers & 11 S.T. officers against unreserved vacancies. For the remaining reserved vacancies, there were dearth of adequate number of eligible/ suitable officers belonging to the said communities as a result of which the Commission had no other alternative but to fill up said vacancies by general candidates in accordance with the decision of the Department concerned, as communicated to the Commission.

Framing of recruitment rules in respect of 32 (thirty-two) different services and posts under Government, the details of which may be seen in Appendix IVA.
2. Government of Finance Department have issued two notifications bearing no. 35-F.T. dated 08.01.2019 and 1292-F.T. dated 30.07.2019 incorporating rules regulating recruitment to the post of Laboratory Assistant in the Chemical Examination Laboratory, West Bengal under the Finance Department, Govt. of West Bengal. Similarly, the Department have also issued two notifications bearing no. 36-F.T. dated 08.01.2019 and 1293-F.T. dated 30.07.2019 incorporating rules regulating recruitment to the post of Deputy Chemical Examiner in the Chemical Examination Laboratory, West Bengal under the Finance Department, Govt. of West Bengal. These Notifications have been issued without consultation with the Commission and hence the cases have been treated as irregular.
3. During the year under report, the Commission has tendered its advice regarding constitution of service for various posts in (i) the Directorate of Horticulture, (ii) the Directorate of Cinchona & other Medicinal Plants and (iii) the Directorate of Food Processing Industries and Horticulture under the Department of Food Processing Industries and Horticulture.

### B. Examination Reforms Cell:

1. During the year under report, the Commission has tendered its advice on draft notification incorporating amendment of rules pertaining to Rule 1, Rule 2(V)(a) and Rule 6 of Part 28 of Chapter II (B) of the West Bengal Services (Training & Examination) Rules, 1953.
2. During the year under report, the Commission has tendered its advice on draft notification incorporating amendment of Chapter III and Chapter IV of the West Bengal Services (Training & Examination) Rules, 1953.
3. During the year under report, the Commission has finalised the syllabi (for both direct recruitment and promotion by selection) for recruitment to the post of Supervisor, ICDS Scheme under the Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare.

Details of all the above mentioned cases may be seen in Appendix IVB.

## PART – VII

### Disciplinary Cases

2019-2020

During the year under report, 126 cases were referred to the Commission for advice of which 79 cases were referred to the Commission for the first time and 47 cases had been referred to the Commission earlier but returned for want of requisite documents and other particulars related to those cases. 49 cases had been pending with the Commission on 31.03.2019. On verification, 41 cases including some of the old cases were found wanting in relevant documents / particulars and were returned to the Govt. 81 cases were under examination of the Commission till close of the year under report. The Commission, in process could tender advice in 53 cases including 1 over riding

case during the year under report details of which are shown in Appendix-V. In 19 cases the Govt. reported acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission. Regarding remaining 26 cases the decision of the Govt. has not been communicated to the Commission till the close of the year under report.

In last year's Annual Report, 18 cases were pending with the Govt. for decision to be taken on the advice of the Commission.

Subsequently, the Govt. intimated acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission in 5 cases but the decision of the Govt. on remaining 6 cases has not been intimated till the close of the year under report.

Irregular Appointment:

There was no case where the Government made irregular appointment to any post within the purview of the recruitment examinations conducted by the Commission during the year under report.

## PART – IX

Overriding Case (including Irregular case etc.)

In December, 2019 the Govt. in the Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms moved the Commission soliciting its views on the issue of guilt & punishment to be imposed upon Charged Officer belonging to the ranks W.B.C.S.(Exe)[Retd.]. The officer was proceeded against the charge for committing gross financial irregularities in managing the affairs of the West Dinajpur Spinning Mill as its M.D., with sincerity and promptness and causing delay in ordering for cancellation of Cotton Bales with Cotton Corporation of India, for which said mill had to incur pecuniary loss to the tune of Rs. 44.37 Lakh.

The Commission found the officer guilty and recommended the penalty of reduction of pay of the C.O. by 3 annual increments till his retirement under Rule 8(iv) of the WBS (CC&A) Rules, 1971. In February, 2020 the Department concerned unilaterally issued Final Order imposing upon the Officer lesser penalty in the form of reduction of pay of the C.O. by 1 annual increment till his retirement and he will not be allowed to earn any increment during such period of reduction in terms of Rule 8(iv) of the WBS (CC&A) Rules, 1971.

## **PART – X**

### **Recruitment Rules/Service Rules**

The Commission during the year under report also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for 32 different categories of services and posts from 14 different departments under the Government of West Bengal. In the previous year, corresponding figures were 34 and 14 respectively.

## **PART – XI**

### **RTI**

During the year under report total 1151 (one thousand one hundred fifty one) number of letters were sent to various RTI applicants by the S.P.I.O, P.S.C.W.B under R.T.I Act, 2005 furnishing various information. Amongst all the R.T.I aspirants, 55 (fifty five) made First Appeals to the Appellate Authority, P.S.C.W.B. The S.P.I.O and the Appellate Authority, in the office of the P.S.C.W.B responsibly accomplished the task of dispatching replies to all the information seekers within the time limit as specified under R.T.I Act, 2005. It is worthwhile to mention that 24 (twenty four) R.T.I cases were eventually referred to the West Bengal Information Commission.
